**AMENDMENT NO. 0001**

Effective the latter of 7/24/25, or the last party signature, the above referenced Contract is amended as follows:

1. In **1.1**, **\$1,180,597,470.00** is replaced by **\$1,209,320,933.00**

2. **A.1.1.3** is amended to add:

Template 39 – Intermediate Level FACT Programs Report

Template 40 – Family Well-being Treatment Program Report

3. In **A.4.3**, “4.8” is replaced by “4.12”

4. **A.5.1.4.2** is amended to add:

The Managing Entity is not required but may include referrals where individuals are simply provided with contact information to service providers. However, the Managing Entity must track all forms of communication for referral requests originating from the Executive Office of the Governor, a legislative office, or the Department.

5. The highlighted portions below amend **B.3.2**. The non-highlighted portions are solely for context and unaffected by this amendment.

**B.3.2** When needed, the Managing Entity (ME) may subcontract **or enter into a rate agreement** for residential services related to the Purchase of Residential Treatment Services (PRTS) for emotionally disturbed children and youth in additional Florida counties, subject to advance written approval of each subcontractor by the Department.

6. The highlighted portions below amend **B.8.9**. The non-highlighted portions are solely for context and unaffected by this amendment.

**B.8.9** The Managing Entity **must receive prior written approval from the Contract Manager for** services funded by this Contract **that are not specifically stated in this Contract**. The Department has final authority to make any and all determinations that affect the health, safety, and well-being of the people of the State of Florida.

7. In **C.1.1.6**, the following sentence is inserted after the first sentence:

Beginning in 2028, the behavioral health care needs assessment will be submitted to the Department no later than March 1 of the applicable year.

8. In **C.1.1.8**, “August 1” is replaced by “September 1”.

9. In **C1.5.6**, “October 31” is replaced by “January 31” and the phrase “Annually by November 30, the” is replaced by “The”.

10. **C.2.1.4** is amended to add:

**C.2.1.4.7** A member of the Managing Entity staff to serve as a Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Children Care Coordinator, in compliance with the provisions of Guidance 4 – Care Coordination.

11. In **C1.2**, the phrase “30 days after this exhibit is incorporated into the Managing Entity’s contract” is replaced by “60 days after the execution of the first Schedule of Funds amendment”.

12. **C1.4** is amended to add:

**C1.4.3 988 Florida Lifeline Center** - The Managing Entity shall execute subcontracts to the 988 Florida Lifeline Center providers identified in **Table 1a**. Allocations for the 988 Florida Lifeline are based on the percentage of total state call volume each center receives. This is intended to ensure centers can hire/maintain staff and meet their 988 network requirements.
