### **C2-11 Fiscal Year 2020-21 Appropriations**

Pursuant to the FY20-21 General Appropriations Act, Ch. 2020-114, Laws of Fla., the Managing Entity shall implement the following, summarized in **Table 1h**:

#### **C2-11.1 Specific Appropriation 370 – CAT Teams**

**C2-11.1.1** Funds provided in Specific Appropriation 370 shall be used to subcontract with the providers in **Table 1h** for the operation of Community Action Treatment (CAT) teams, per the terms of **Guidance 32**. The recurring base appropriation projects in are funded from general revenue funds.

**C2-11.1.2** Funds provided in Specific Appropriation 370 include the additional sum of \$750,000.00 from the General Revenue Fund to procure for additional Community Action Teams in the areas of greatest need and to ensure statewide coverage, pursuant to section 394.495, Florida Statutes: Charlotte Behavioral Health Care, Inc. – Charlotte.

#### **C2-11.2 Specific Appropriation 371 Project**

From the funds in Specific Appropriation 371, the following project is funded from recurring general revenue funds:

**C2-11.2.1** Mental Health Care - Forensic treatment services..... 700,800

**C2-11.2.2** Supported employment services for individuals with mental health disorders as detailed in **Table 1h**.

**C2-11.3 Specific Appropriation 373 Projects**

**C2-11.3.1 Family Intensive Treatment Funding**

**C2-11.3.1.1** From the funds in Specific Appropriation 373, General Revenue Fund is provided to implement the Family Intensive Treatment (FIT) team model designed to provide intensive team-based, family-focused, comprehensive services to families in the child welfare system with parental substance abuse.

**C2-11.3.1.2** From the funds in Specific Appropriation 373, \$840,000 from the General Revenue Fund shall be provided to Centerstone of Florida for the operation of a Family Intensive Treatment (FIT) team (recurring base appropriations project).

**C2-11.3.1.3** The Managing Entity shall execute and manage subcontracts for these services in accordance with **Guidance 18**.

**C2-11.3.2 Women’s Special Funding**

From the funds in Specific Appropriation 373, General Revenue Fund shall continue to be provided for the expansion of substance abuse services for pregnant women, mothers, and their affected families. These services shall include the expansion of residential treatment, outpatient treatment with housing support, outreach, detoxification, childcare, and post-partum case management supporting both the mother and child consistent with recommendations from the Statewide Task Force on Prescription Drug Abuse and Newborns. Priority for services shall be given to counties with the greatest need and available treatment capacity.
